# Bling Rule is Gone!

It was announced last week that, effective immediately, the MidAmerica Region has rescinded the no-bling rule for U8 and U9 solo costumes. The rule was put in place to help make a change in all regions to make costumes for the youngest competitors simpler and less expensive. Unfortunately, no other regions picked it up. This meant that MidAmerica Region competitors at Nationals were

competing against dancers with "blinged" costumes. The solution some sought was to have TWO dance costumes-- this was the opposite of the desired outcome of the rule.

#### **Private Lessons**

These have been used in the past to brush up on a specific dance, overcome an obstacle in competition, or to get some additional focused work done.
